VEHICLE PARKING ORDINANCE NO. 413

Q: How long may a vehicle or trailer be parked or left standing on a county highway?

A: Up to 72 hours, after which the vehicle or trailer must be removed from the street or parked in a location outside of a 500 feet radius of its prior location.

Q: Regarding stopping, standing, or parking a vehicle, what do the curb colors mean?

A: A red curb means no stopping, standing or parking anytime. A yellow curb is used for the immediate loading and unloading of passengers, (5 minute maximum) or materials (20 minutes maximum). A white curb means only for loading and unloading of passengers or picking up and depositing mail. A green allows for stopping, standing or parking for a specified amount of time only.

Q: How far must a vehicle or trailer be parked from a community mailbox or cluster of mailboxes? A: At least 15 feet away.

Q: When may a commercial vehicle over 10,000 pounds, or a commercial trailer or semi-trailer be parked or left standing on a highway or street within a residential district?

A: This type of parking is allowed when picking up and making deliveries, or when parked in connection with the aid of a service to or on a property in the block. All other commercial vehicles parking in a residential district are subject to administrative fines from \$250 - \$750.

Q: How long may a recreational vehicle be parked in the street?

A: Only for a period not to exceed 48 hours, twice a month. It must be in front of the owner's residence or in front of the home of someone the owner is visiting and has permission from to park there. If signs are posted on county highways, 2 hour parking is allowed.

Q: What are the consequences for violating this ordinance?

A: Violations are penalized with an infraction. Each day of violation is a separate offense.
